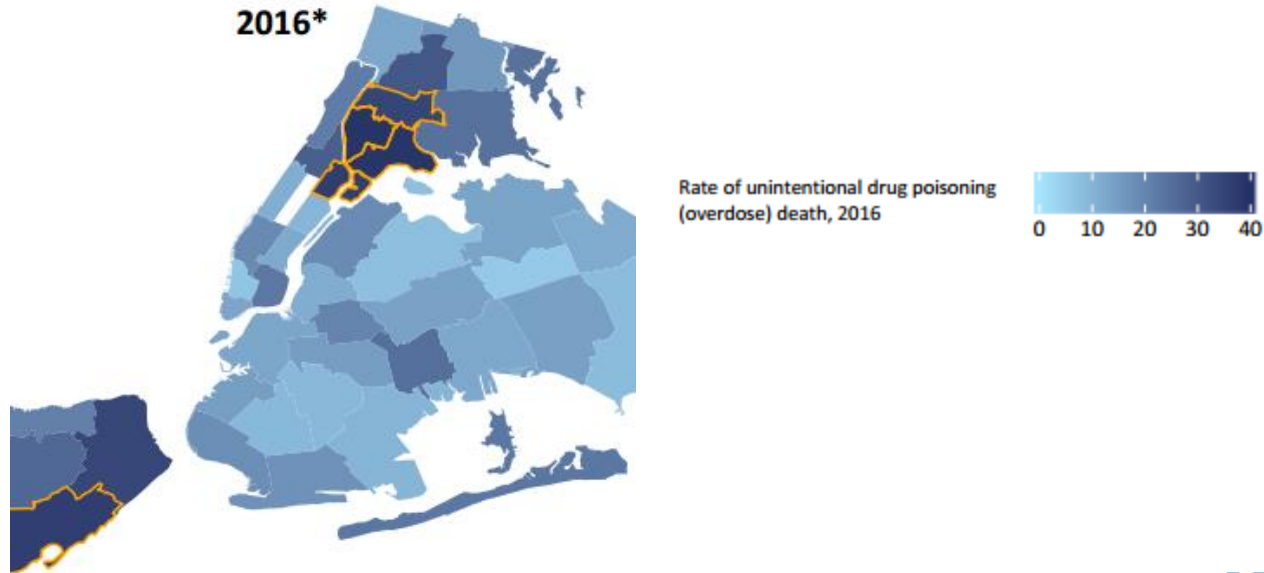
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Montefiore Medical Center

Montefiore Medical Center

- Largest medical center in the Bronx
- Over 20 primary care sites
- Two hospitals in the Bronx with many affiliated hospitals in the Bronx and lower Westchester
- Three OTPs serving >3500 patients
- Three intensive drug treatment programs
- Over 1500 post-graduate trainees
- Associated with Einstein Medical College
- 150 Internal Medicine residents including 25 in Social Medicine Primary Care track

The Bronx

- Poorest borough in NYC
- Diverse
- High rates of SUD
- High rates of opioid overdose
- 14 OTPs serving approximately 6,500 patients



Goals

- Increase knowledge of SUD diagnosis
- Increase knowledge of SUD treatment, especially OUD
- Increase resident comfort in working with patients with SUD
- Decrease resident prejudice towards patients with SUD

PGY1

- Most sessions occur in spring
- Tobacco cessation
- Unhealthy alcohol use
- Chronic pain and opioid management
- AA meeting attendance and discussion
- Presentation by AA member
- Presentation and discussion with OTP patients
- Seminar series covering
 - OUD diagnosis and treatment
 - Cocaine
 - Marijuana and synthetic cannabinoids

PGY2

- Visit to OTP
- Chronic pain management (starting 2018)

PGY 3

- Buprenorphine in primary care (seminar)
- Five station OSCE
 - Precontemplative opioid user in withdrawal
 - Contemplative man with AUD
 - Young adult cocaine user with anxiety
 - Precontemplative woman with AUD and insomnia
 - Woman with OUD (maintenance stage) with acute pain

Addiction Medicine Elective

- PGY 2 or 3
- Two weeks
- OTP
- Community based treatment of OUD
- Syringe exchange
- 12 step meetings

Challenges

- Departmental support
- Funds/time
- Institutional barriers
